L yallpur Khalsa College, Jalandhar, the premier historical educational institution of Northern India, ranked with Grade A by NAAC in 2020 and awarded with Potential For Excellence by UGC in 2016, is ranked among the top institutions of country. It has been given Potential for Excellence Status by UGC. It is also approved under FIST (Level – 0 category) and has received Star College status from Ministry of Science and Technology. The genesis of this great institution dedicated to selfless-service of humanity dates back to 1908, when it was established first as Khalsa School at Lyallpur (now known as Faislabad in Pakistan) and later developed into a college in 1926. After its reestablishment in Jalandhar in 1948 following the partition of the country, the college has established itself as a leader in the field of higher education. Currently, it is imparting quality education to around 5000 students including over 1600 girls.



Synthesizing the best of traditional values with the best of modern knowledge, the college, during decades of its existence, has produced a large number of distinguished alumni who have made the country proud. The list includes the movie and theater icon late Sh. Prithviraj Kapoor, S. Buta Singh, former Home Minister of India, Late S. Balbir Singh, Ex-Member Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha, S. Iqbal Singh former Governor Pudducherry, S. Barjinder Singh Hamdard, Chief Editor Daily Ajit Group of Newspapers, Dr. J.S. Puar, Former Vice Chancellor of Punjabi University, Dr. S.P. Singh, Former Vice Chancellor Guru Nanak Dev University, late S. Bharpur Singh, former Chairman P.S.Ed.B., former Hockey Captains Padamshree S. Ajitpal Singh and Padamshree S.Pargat Singh, famous folk singers S. Malkit Singh and S. Sarabjit Singh Cheema etc.

The College offers rich academic diversity to its students through over 45 academic programmes at graduate and postgraduate degree, diploma and certificate levels in the streams of Humanities, Commerce, Computer Science and Information Technology, Science and Physiotherapy. The list includes programmes ranging from traditional to most modern and technology based, job oriented courses. The UGC has granted the college vocational courses- B.Voc. (Printing Technology) and B.Voc. (Software System). These two courses have been awarded by the UGC under Vocational Courses Scheme with a financial Assistance of Rs. 1.85 Crore and each of these job oriented courses is of graduation degree level and of three year duration with 10+2 as eligibility. The recently established Music department has become the most sought after department for the students aspiring to make their career in the field of music.

The College has a wide campus of 28 acres with lush green lawns, well equipped computerized office and library, internet cyber centre and two dedicated leased lines for internet access. It has 87 class rooms and 42 well equipped science laboratories and instrument rooms. There are separate blocks for each faculty with sufficient number of classrooms, galleries and faculty rooms with internet facility. There are separate hostels for boys and girls built on modern lines.

The college has research oriented world class infrastructure for high level educational programmes at graduate, postgraduate, diploma and certificate level in diverse disciplines which makes it the first choice of students in professional, vocational as well as traditional courses. To facilitate research, the college runs four research centers - Centre of Historical Studies, Centre for Guru Granth Sahib Studies, Punjab Centre for Migration Studies and Sardar Balbir Singh Centre for Science. These Centres hold seminars, symposia, and publish

The College has a computerized two storey central library in addition to departmental libraries maintained by different faculties. The spacious library houses over 90000 books including a good collection of rare study material, national, international journals and biographies in Punjabi, English, Hindi and Urdu. It has collaboration with DELNET (Developing Library Network) through which it is connected to 2073 libraries in India and 21 overseas libraries overseas. The library also subscribes to INFLIBNET whereby more than 2100 e-journals, 51,000 e books and a bibliographic database MathSciNet containing more than two million reviews of research articles in Mathematics are made available to faculty members through N-LIST programme. The library is arranged according to DDC 22nd latest edition, and provides open shelf system with Bar Coding facility. The library provides low-cost Internet and reprographic services to the users.

The Placement cell of the college has earned respect among the recruiting agencies as well as student community through its professionalism and dedication to recruitment, employment and training of the students and by putting them on the pathway to exciting global employment opportunities or further studies. Many firms of eminence visit the college and arrange for professional industrial trainings.

The NSS, the NCC wings, the Youth Welfare department, the Social Sensitization Cell, the Legal Aid Cell and numerous Clubs and Associations formed at the department levels work with a student focused approach to ensure a supportive, individualized and innovative learning experience. Various departments of the college organize numerous academic and extension programmes throughout the year. A wide range of activities are undertaken by the college, ranging from helping victims of the natural calamities to tree plantation and cleanliness drives in villages, from blood donation and pulse polio immunization camps to programmes in social awareness. The department of Physiotherapy organizes health and fitness camps for neighbourhood community, from time to time. Under Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Programme of the Government of India the college has been assigned five villages. The college offers consultancy services in different areas. Faculty members act as evaluators, examiners, subject experts and judges in various exams, interviews and competitions. The Department of Physiotherapy offers consultancy through its OPD where patients of neuromuscular disorders such as cerebral palsy are offered treatment at nominal charges. The Gurudwara Sahib of the college attaches students to their spiritual roots.

The name of Lyallpur Khalsa College has become synonymous with excellence in sports. The world class infrastructure with well-maintained playgrounds, quality training and coaching, well equipped conditioning hall and a host of facilities including scholarships, special incentives and free hostel and mess facility, provide the budding sportspersons of the college an ideal platform for university, state and national level competitions. To promote Hockey in the region, the college has signed an MOU with Hockey Academy of Punjab & Sind Bank. Separate new block for sportsmen has been constructed in the boys hostel. The College has created history by winning the Teja Singh Samundari Overall Sports Championship Trophy of Guru Nanak Dev University with record points for 24 times, out of which 11 times it has been won consecutively.

Lyallpur Khalsa College has established itself as the frontrunner college in field of co-curricular activities as well. It has bagged the First Runners Up Trophy in Zonal Youth Festival and Second Runners Up Trophy in Inter-Zonal Youth Festival of Guru Nanak Dev University for 2022-2023. Apart from their unprecedented performance in Youth festivals, the students made the college proud by winning in numerous events organized by different colleges and universities on state and national level. The most important highlight of the session 2022-23 was the International Event 'Bhangra World Cup 2022' held in Surrey in which around 55 teams participated which included teams from Ireland, Canada, America etc.

Student centric teaching learning, a most updated infrastructure, a student friendly administration, special focus on sports and other co-curricular activities are the best practices of the institution. In academics, the students of the college secured 181 positions in university examinations. All such achievements are a result of the environment and support services provided for the welfare and growth of the students. Numerous scholarships and concessions are awarded to the needy and deserving students as a support.

CODE OF CONDUCT

4. Quarrels and disputes should be avoided and self-restraint should be exercised. In the event of a dispute, a written complaint should be made to the Principal at once.
5. No damage to the College property will be condoned under any circumstances.
6. Students are expected to keep aloof from active politics as it adversely affects their academic pursuits.
7. Students are required to apply for leave whenever they are unable to attend the class. Printed leave-forms are available in the college bookshop.

Students who are found guilty of infringement of code of conduct shall be liable to punishment in the form of fine, expulsion from the college and withdrawal of admission from the University depending on the seriousness of the offence. On top of all, the college can refuse admission to such students in the coming years.

ADMISSION CELL

To facilitate the entire process of admission for the students, a dedicated Admission Cell has been established near the entrance of the college where representatives from all the departments guide, counsel and assist students about the available courses, eligibility, admission process, scholarships, facilities and other information needed by the students. Students are advised to visit Admission Cell for any assistance required.

ADMISSION RULES AND GENERAL GUIDELINES

- The Principal reserves the right to grant or refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason.
- Admission to the college is made provisionally at the sole risk and responsibility of the student and is subject to the subsequent approval of GNDU. If approval to the admission is withheld by the competent authority for the reason that the student has failed to provide the required information or document in time/has hidden some information/given false information/is not eligible to join the class otherwise, the entire responsibility in such a case will lie with the student himself/herself. No claim whatsoever will be admissible in such a case.
- Admission to different courses is made as per eligibility conditions of Guru Nanak Dev University.
- Admission to various courses will be made strictly on the basis of merit or first come first serve basis.
- Candidates whose results are to be declared late can seek admission in the next higher class provisionally subject to the availability of seat and approval of the university.

ADMISSION THROUGH CENTRALISED PORTAL

Note: Eligibility Certificate is must for admission in B.A./B.Sc./BCA/B.Com/BBA/MA/M.Sc./M.Com part-I & Post Graduate Diplomas.

Instructions. In event of non-production of required documents, students belonging to the relevant category will not be eligible for this exemption.
- Eligibility certificate from Guru Nanak Dev University for the students who have passed their qualifying examination from Institutions other than GNDU, Panjab University, Punjabi University or PSEB.
- Admission of students who fail to submit Eligibility Certificate by the required dates shall stand cancelled without any further notice.
- Students whose result is declared late should submit the Eligibility Certificate within 15 days of the declaration of the result.

RAGGING IN ANY FORM OR MANNER IS STRICTLY BANNED IN THE COLLEGE

Any student indulging in ragging shall be liable to exemplary punishment as per the orders of the Supreme Court and the guidelines of UGC.

What constitutes Ragging: Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- (a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- (b) Including in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension there of in any fresher or any other student;
- (c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- (d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- (e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of student;
- (f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- (g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- (h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other students;
- (i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student; With or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student

Punishment for Ragging

- i. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- ii. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- iii. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- iv. Withholding results.
- v. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- vi. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- vii. Cancellation of admission.
- viii. Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters.
- ix. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
